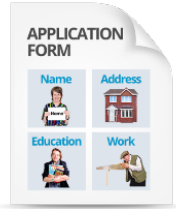
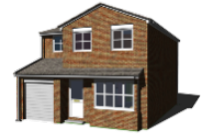




Houses/Apartments owned by Other Housing Associations



Speak to your Support Worker.

Register on the Council's housing list.

State that you want to be housed by your chosen Housing Association.



When nominated to a Housing Association, you will be interviewed.

The Housing Association will have to get Garda clearance for you.



If you pass the assessment, your tenancy will have to be approved by the Council.

You can be offered a home anywhere.

But if you don't like it, you can refuse.

You can only refuse an offer of housing twice.



If you accept, your rent will be based on your income, or it will be a fixed amount.

Your rent will be affordable.



A service charge may be charged depending on where you live.



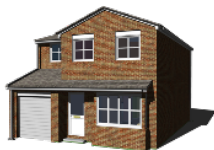
The Housing Association has to register your tenancy with the Residential Tenancies Board (RTB).

The RTB protects your rights as a tenant.

You will receive a letter.



You have to keep within the terms of your Tenancy Agreement.



Maintenance is monitored by the Housing Association.

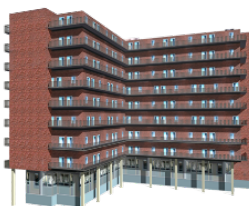


You can apply for a grant to help you purchase furniture and white goods in your new home.



If you ever want to leave your home, you will have to give minimum notice to the Housing Association.
